Girls Day registration runs through April 15

Facilities Management will host its second annual Girls Day on Thursday, June 29 from 8 a.m.-3:30 p.m. In an effort to increase interest and education in construction and the building trades among young women, FM will host girls between the ages of 12-18 to participate in various planned activities to show off our work.

Due to the success of last year's inaugural event, this year's Girls Day has expanded to include all University of Virginia employees (not just FM staff). The event will feature new stops along the behind-the-scenes tour of work sites, including the University Hospital Expansion and Ruffner Hall's solar panels. The vendor information fair will take place at John Paul Jones Arena this year and feature additional vendors and hands-on activities.

Registration for FM staff started March 15 and runs through April 15. Registration will open to the UVA-wide community starting on April 1.

Manager Performance Survey deadline is March 27

Employees may anonymously review any one supervisor within FM

Facilities Management employees are encouraged to submit responses to the 2017 Manager Performance Survey through Monday, March 27.

Each employee received a custom website link to the survey via their work email address on March 8. To ensure

all responses remain anonymous, the survey is once again being conducted through Survey Monkey — the emailed invitation to participate in the survey came from "<u>enc2n@virginia.edu</u> via <u>surveymonkey.com</u>."

Staff members will have the option to rate their own supervisor or any one of the 200-plus supervisors, managers or Directors within FM, further allowing participants to maintain anonymity.



The survey asks participants to rate the selected supervisor or manager in seven key competency areas with the opportunity to provide comments or examples. Employees are encouraged to provide first-hand, recent knowledge of the person they are reviewing.

The survey questions are primarily multiple-choice and should take approximately 10 minutes to answer. Survey responses will not be accepted after 11:59 p.m. Monday, March 27.

UVA marks first 'zero waste' basketball game in ACC

The University of Virginia has become the first Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) men's basketball team to achieve "zero waste" (defined as diverting at least 90 percent of waste) during this year's Game Day Challenge. UVA fans recycled and composted 4,454 pounds of materials, keeping 94 percent of waste from the landfill.

With the help of 75 student volunteers, UVA Athletics, Aramark, UVA Recycling and the Office for Sustainability, fans at the sold-out game at the John Paul Jones Arena placed paper, bottles and cans into recycling bins and a new bin was added for food waste and compostable items during the Feb. 27 game.

Student volunteers staffed each waste station to sort materials and educate fans about composting and recycling. After the game, volunteers helped clean the stands, segregating compostables and recyclables to

UVA employees are eligible to have their 2016 tax return prepared for free by volunteers certified by the IRS if they meet certain requirements.

Tax prep services will take place until April 18 by appointment only at the following places:

- University Medical Center, 999 Grove St.

To schedule an appointment and confirm all documents needed, visit <u>www.cvilletaxaid.org</u> or call 972-1703.

UVA staff who meet the following criteria are eligible:

- Only need to file a state return in Virginia.
- Earn \$55,000 or less annually (including spouse's income).
- Do not have rental income.
- Are U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
- If you want to file a "married filing jointly" return, both spouses must be present.
