Bernie says!



High 5 for HAND SAFETY

Follow these machine guard tips to ensure hands are protected when operating machinery.

Prevent contact

Make sure machine guards prevent hands from making contact with dangerous moving parts.

Be tamper resistant

Secure safeguards firmly to the machine so employees can't tamper with or remove them.

Protect against falling items

Guards should prevent small objects from falling into moving parts and becoming dangerous projectiles.

4 Post warnings

Place warning signs near machines and make sure they're legible.

Train, Train, Train

Even the best safeguard can't protect workers if they don't know how and why to use it.

The primary cause of hand injuries is equipment not performing as expected.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY AUTUMN SAFETY TIPS

 \rightarrow Vehicles:

- Use your headlights in the mornings and evenings. With the fall season upon us and clocks turned back, it gets darker earlier. Extra caution is needed when driving to and from UVA and around Grounds.
- When it's frosty out, ensure your windshield wipers are off and defrost or scrape the windshield before running the wipers.
- Don't leave your vehicle idling.
- Lock your doors when the vehicle is not in use.
- Look out for pedestrians.
- Make sure your vehicle has sufficient reflectors.
- Contact FM Fleet if your vehicle needs maintenance: <u>FM-Fleet@virginia.edu</u>
- \rightarrow Look out for slick stairs and walkways
- \rightarrow Assess your high-visibility winter gear and replace anything that is worn out or defective.
- → Be sure your designated snow-duty staff have winter boots.

- \rightarrow Get a <u>flu shot.</u>
- \rightarrow At Home:
 - Check your smoke alarm batteries!
 - Inspect your fire extinguisher
 - Inspect your home first aid kit. Replace anything that has expired or run out.
 - Be careful when using space heaters.
 - Use your fireplace safely: Have your chimney cleaned, use a screen, and be sure embers are out before leaving.
 - Practice ladder safety. Whether they're at the job site, hanging decorations in the office, or cleaning gutters at home, be sure to inspect ladders before use, check for proper angles, have the right ladder for the job, and maintain three points of contact when ascending or descending.
- → Stay home if you feel unwell If you are not feeling well or have been exposed to COVID, it is safer to stay home. Contact Employee Health for guidance: 434-924-2013



OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY GET YOUR FLU SHOT

UVA employees have increased access to flu shots this year at the <u>UVA pharmacy locations</u> and their local in-network pharmacy locations.

Even if you have a health plan that is not from UVA, most health plans in the U.S. are required to cover the cost of the basic flu shot at 100%. In addition,

Faculty, staff and team members covered by the **UVA Health Plan may obtain a flu shot through their Primary Care Physician**, or at one of the UVA pharmacies, **CVS pharmacies**, or any pharmacy in Aetna's National Pharmacy Network, if you present your Aetna card at the pharmacy. Included are pharmacies at Giant Eagle, Harris Teeter, Kmart, Kroger, Rite Aid, Walgreens, and Wegmans. Because the vaccination is covered by our health plan, you need only show your UVA Health Plan Aetna ID card.

Honoring Veterans: Immortalizing Their Stories

Gregory Saathoff, M.D., a professor at the University of Virginia School of Medicine, along with UVA students and volunteers, has taken up a project to capture local veterans' heartfelt narratives on video. "For me, this is an obligation," Saathoff said. "In fact, we have volunteers who feel the same way."

The group sought to conduct nearly 50 interviews of WWII veterans under the title "<u>A Nickel for Your Story</u>." They contacted local veterans' groups, assisted living homes, and were even contacted by family members to make it happen.

Since then, Saathoff and volunteers continue to interview veterans from all different wars.

Rewards and Recognition is BACK and is a way to professionally recognize your co-workers whose contributions make UVA a better place for students, faculty, researchers, patients, and staff. Active salaried full-time and part-time Classified, University Staff, and temporary or wage employees are eligible for recognition. Temporary or wage employees are not eligible for recognition leave.



FACILITIES MANAGEMENT REWARD & RECOGNITION PROGRAM

How it works:

- Submit an online nomination: <u>https://at.virginia.edu/thAjvt</u>
- 2. **The employee's supervisor will complete** the online nomination with a suggested level
- 3. **The employee's director reviews** the nomination for approval and submits to FM Finance for processing and payment.
- Funding for the R & R comes from the approving director's budget. If the nomination is from outside of FM, then the outside nominating department covers any financial reward.
- 5. The chief facilities officer will receive a biweekly report of all nominations for review and final approval in advance of final processing.

UVA Team Uses High-Tech Scanning to Preserve African American School

"We are documenting historic buildings using the laser scanner to capture the surface data of everything around it," said Will Rourk, a 3D specialist with the UVA Library who also teaches a

class at the Architecture School called "3D Cultural Informatics," taught in collaboration with Andy Johnston, an architectural history professor and director of the Program in Historic Preservation.

Another man who spent time in the attic is Jody Lahendro, a preservation architect who recently retired from Facilities Management at the University. He is working with the AMMD Pine Grove Project, a group of local residents trying to preserve the school.

Lahendro said the plans are to restore Pine

Grove as a community center and a museum. The Pine Grove School Project has been listed on the Virginia Landmarks Register and the National Register of Historic Places and the group is opposed to the proposed Green Ridge Recycling and Disposal Facility, scheduled to be built adjacent to the school.

The landfill issue brought Fjord, the anthropology professor, on board.

"I became involved in Pine Grove immediately after it was made public that a massive, Canadianowned waste company wished to build a 1,200-acre landfill, to bring waste from across the northern Atlantic Seaboard to a landfill that would surround the historic Pine Grove Rosenwald School and its heritage Black community," Fjord said. "It would reroute its historic road and entrance. ... When a site study followed, it was discovered that extensive wetlands would be impacted, and Green Ridge Recycling changed its plan to dispose of the same amount of waste in just the half of the parcel to intensify geometrically the impact on this historic school and the lands owned by former students that are adjacent to it."

The landfill also brought on board the Environmental and Regulatory Law Clinic at the UVA School of Law. The clinic is working with the Pine Grove School Project to protect the schoolhouse and surround-ing property from the proposed landfill, an effort that is currently in the courts.

"This is more than a building," said Muriel Branch, president of the AMMD Pine Grove Project. "This is a place where we gathered to be educated as well as gain positive values, teamwork and faith."

COVID-19 RESOURCES How to Celebrate the Holidays Safely

Many of us are looking forward to gathering for the holidays. The best way to minimize the risk of illness

and keep your family and friends safer is to follow the guidelines below and <u>to get vaccinated if</u> <u>you're eligible</u>. Most individuals over the age of 5 can now be vaccinated against COVID-19.

- → **Getting vaccinated** is the best way to protect those under 5 and others who cannot be vaccinated or may be immunocompromised.
- $\rightarrow\,$ Wear well-fitting masks over your nose and mouth if:
 - → You are **not fully vaccinated** and are in a public, indoor setting (supermarkets, movie theaters, etc.).
 - → You are fully vaccinated and in public indoor settings in communities with substantial to high transmission.
- \rightarrow **Gather outdoors:** Outdoors is safer than indoors.
- \rightarrow Avoid crowded, poorly ventilated spaces.
- $\rightarrow\,$ If you are sick or have symptoms:
 - \rightarrow Don't host or attend a gathering.
 - \rightarrow Let your supervisor know. Do not come to work if you are sick.
 - → Contact Employee Health for guidance: 434-924-2013

If you are traveling for the holidays, visit <u>CDC's Travel page</u> to find tips for you and your family. The CDC recommends delaying travel until you are <u>fully vaccinated</u>.

Other special considerations:

- People who have weakened immune systems due to a condition or necessary medications may not be fully protected even if they are fully vaccinated and have received an additional dose. They should continue to take all precautions recommended for unvaccinated people, including wearing a well-fitted mask.
- You may choose to wear a mask if a member of your household has a weakened immune system, is at increased risk for severe disease, or is unvaccinated.
- If you are gathering with a group of people from multiple households, you could consider additional precautions (e.g., avoiding crowded indoor spaces before travel, taking a test) in advance of gathering to further protect each other,
- Do not put a face cover on children younger than 2 years old.

By working together, we can enjoy safer holidays, travel, and protect our own health as well as the health of our family and friends.

IT'S SAFE TO GET YOUR FLU SHOT & COVID-19 VACCINE/BOOSTER AT THE SAME TIME!

Staying up to date on all vaccinations will be especially important this year, experts say.

The <u>CDC recommends</u> an <u>annual flu vaccine</u> for everyone 6 months and older, and says ideally everyone should be vaccinated by the end of October. It takes 10 to 14 days for the flu vaccine to take full effect. If you wait until the flu begins circulating, your body may not have time to build up protection. Vaccine options vary by age but include several types of shots or a nasal spray version.

One caution: COVID-19, colds and flu share similar symptoms. If you feel ill, the CDC says to postpone a vaccination appointment until you're better to avoid getting others sick.

Vaccination remains the best way to end the pandemic. Unvaccinated individuals are at the highest risk of severe illness due to COVID-19 or Flu.

COVID-19 Case Rates in Virginia by Vaccination Status

Between 1/17/2021 & 10/30/2021, unvaccinated individuals developed COVID-19 at a rate 5.1 times higher than fully vaccinated and 2.3 times higher than partially vaccinated individuals.

- 93% of the UVA community are fully vaccinated as of September 15, 2021! Schedule yours: <u>https://vaccinate.virginia.gov/</u>
- If you have any symptoms, contact Employee Health immediately: 434-924-2013
- If you are a close contact or have a household member test positive for COVID-19, contact Employee Health for guidance: 434-924-2013
- Unvaccinated and/or immunocompromised individuals should wear masks any time they are around other people and take extra precautions to avoid crowded spaces or other environments where there is increased risk of transmission.
- Everyone is strongly encouraged to get a flu vaccine.

LOCAL COMMUNITY TRANSMISSION LEVELS

"Community Transmission" is defined as spread of an illness for which the source of infection is <u>unknown, or</u> <u>simply encountered in the local community</u>, like grocery shopping or at the movie theater.

Because COVID-19 is highly transmissible and can be spread by people who do not know they have the disease, risk of transmission within a community can be difficult to determine.

Community spread in Charlottesville and surrounding counties that employees may commute from remains HIGH & Substantial.

We still need to:

- Follow healthy hygiene practices
- Stay at home when sick with any symptoms
- Practice physical distancing to lower the risk of disease spread
- Use a cloth face covering in indoor and community settings when physical distancing cannot be maintained and where required.

TESTING RESOURCES/PREVALENCE TESTING FOR UVA FM EMPLOYEES

- <u>UVA-required prevalence testing</u> for unvaccinated employees: Saliva testing at the Student Activities Building, by <u>appointment ONLY</u>:
 - Make an appointment: <u>https://time2test.sites.virginia.edu/</u> (log in with Netbadge.)
 - See sites & hours: <u>https://besafe.virginia.edu/testing-sites-and-hours</u> If you have had COVID-19, you are exempt from testing for <u>150 days</u> after your positive test.
- <u>Illness or symptoms, regardless of your vaccination status</u>: Stay home, inform your supervisor, and call Employee Health for testing and/or guidance at 434-924-2013.
- If you <u>think you have been exposed</u>, OR <u>someone in your close contacts or household has</u> <u>symptoms</u>, reach out to Employee Health for testing and/or guidance at 434-924-2013.
- If you are <u>not experiencing symptoms</u>, but would like to test for peace of mind:
 - Let's Get Checked at-home kit—this test will not satisfy UVA's prevalence testing requirements for unvaccinated employees: <u>https://at.virginia.edu/oAkYIE</u>
 - UVA Asymptomatic Saliva Testing, details listed above.

Remember: What is mild for you may be life-threatening for another.

FACE COVERS: STILL WORTH IT

Face covering requirements at UVA FM, per Policy SEC-045 and FM's On-Grounds Work Guidelines:

- Unvaccinated students, faculty, staff, contractors, and visitors must wear a face cover outdoors.
- Everyone must wear a face cover when:
 - In shared spaces indoors.
 - In FM vehicles with a passenger
 - Indoors at any <u>UVA properties</u>
 - Engaged with K-12 students
 - Using public transportation (UTS, other buses, taxis, rideshares, etc.)
 - In the Shoe Truck
- Consider wearing a face cover outside of work during activities or outings with others who are not fully vaccinated.
