Did You Know? NEW Location: Mobile Audiometric Testing

October is Protect Your Hearing Month!

One of the ways UVA FM helps to protect worker hearing is by conducting annual *audiometric testing* for employees within the UVA FM <u>Hearing</u> <u>Conservation Program</u> (HCP). Note the NEW location starting next week at the <u>Leander McCormick</u> <u>Observatory (600 McCormick Road).</u>



Audiometric testing determines the quietest sound you can hear at various frequencies. Repeating the test annually can allow you to track changes in your hearing.

New employees enrolled in the Hearing Conservation Program also receive audiometric testing within6 months of hiring. Employees not a part of the FM Hearing Conservation Program can speak to theirdoctor about a hearing test.Email FM-OHS@virginia.edu if you think you should be in the HCP.

Tools for Your Toolbox: Hearing Loss & Wellbeing

The effects of noise-induced hearing loss (NIHL) is often underestimated or underappreciated, because it is a chronic illness and the affects don't appear until later in life.

Hearing loss can affect the mental, physical, and emotional wellbeing of an individual over time:

- → Isolation: As hearing loss worsens, hearing and understanding others becomes increasingly difficult, which can lead to isolation.
- → Other Chronic Health Issues: Hearing loss is associated with cognitive (mental) decline and heart problems, such as high blood pressure and heart disease.

MAINTENANCE MATTERS

Regularly inspect your hearing protection devices. Worn-out ear cushions can reduce effectiveness. Replace as needed!

- \rightarrow **Depression**: Hearing loss is also strongly associated with depression.
- → Missing Out: Hearing loss can lead to loss of enjoyment, when all the sounds we want to hear (e.g., music, voice of loved one) become muted and lack quality.
- → <u>Ringing in the ears (tinnitus)</u>: This often occurs along with hearing loss and can disrupt sleep and concentration and is associated with both depression and anxiety.

On Thursday, September 26th, UVA FM Occupational Training hosted the annual HVAC Trades Seminar at UVA Alumni Hall, attended by 45 FM professionals that deal with HVAC equipment as part of their job. Vendors from Trane presented on new and emerging refrigerants and equipment transitions, and set up handson displays for variable refrigerant flow (VRF) and fan arrays. Thank you to everyone who contributed:

- → Justin Callihan and Paul Stevens of UVA FM E&U and Scott Mahanes from UVA FM Automation Services provided an overview of UVA's energy systems, covering generation, distribution, metering, and balancing of hot and cold hydro-services.
- → Erick Gomez from UVA Sustainability connected the panel discussion to current and future sustainability initiatives.
- → Shelomith Gonzalez of UVA FM-OHS updated attendees on electrical safety efforts and encouraged participation in the Electrical Safety Focus Team.
- → Danny Davis, UVA FM Apprenticeship Consultant, discussed the FM Apprenticeship Program, highlighting evaluations, annual contracts, and instructor development.
- → Dan Shantler from UVA FM Systems Control briefed attendees on UVA's building automation systems and their relation to HVAC maintenance.
